CEMETERY RULES & REGULATIONS

SECTION 1: GENERAL

A. Purpose:

- a. The Town of Buckfield manages the following cemeteries: Andrews, Barry/Ricker, Buckfield-Damon, Chaffin, Churchill, Crocker, Drew, Decoster, East Buckfield, Hammond, Keene/Shaw, Lothrop, Maxim/Hathaway, Packard, Paine, Prince, Swan, Turner and Whitman. The town also manages the funds established and any appropriated monies approved by the voters for the benefits of these cemeteries.
- b. The town will work to preserve and protect the Cemeteries as peaceful, beautiful and historic areas that serve as reverent symbols of the citizens' respect for the deceased. To accomplish these goals, rules and regulations ("Rules and Regulations") are used to guide the conduct of individuals while they visit the Cemeteries. In formulating these Rules and Regulations, a balance of the interests of the various stakeholders (purchasers and owners of rights of interment or inurnment; family, friends, and acquaintances of the deceased buried therein; Town citizens and taxpayers; maintenance workers; and commercial service providers is taken into consideration. In particular, the Rules and Regulations are based upon the unique aesthetics of each cemetery, the cost of maintaining them, historical preservation, civic pride, and, most important of all, safety of all who enter these Cemeteries. All persons visiting any Buckfield Cemetery will be expected to abide by these Rules and Regulations.

- B. Amendment:** The Town of Buckfield hereby reserves the right to adopt additional rules and regulations or to amend, alter, or repeal any rule or regulation at any time they deem appropriate. The Town also reserves the right to waive or temporarily suspend or modify one or more of these Rules and Regulations in unique situations that may arise in which strict enforcement may result in undue and unfair hardship or other unintended consequence. Such waivers or temporary suspensions or modifications of Rules and Regulations are expected to be very rare, based upon good reasoning and rationale, and not necessarily binding precedent for later situations.

- C. Reserved Rights:** The Town reserves the right to enlarge, reduce, re-plot burial lots not yet sold and/or change the boundaries or grading of the Cemeteries, or a section or sections thereof, from time to time, including the right to modify or change the location of, or remove or re-grade roads, drives, or walks, or any part thereof. The Town also reserves the right to lay, maintain and operate, or alter or change, water pipe lines and water faucets for the dispersal of water and drainage purposes in said Town Cemeteries. The Town reserves to itself and to those

lawfully entitled thereto, a perpetual right of ingress and egress over burial sites for the purpose of passing to and from other burial sites.

- D. Access:** The Town Cemeteries shall be open to the public seven days per week from sunrise to sunset. Fall/Winter access to all cemeteries will be limited to pedestrian traffic only. Cement blockading may be placed at the entrances of Cemetery ways no later than October 30th of each year and removed no later than May 1st. The Town or their agents, maintenance workers, and funeral workers may enter the Cemetery outside of these hours if necessary for the timely completion of their tasks.

- E. Vehicles:** Maximum speed is five (5) miles per hour. No vehicle may be driven or parked across or upon any burial site. Parking or leaving any vehicle on a public road or drive in such a way as to prevent any other vehicle from passing is prohibited. Commercial vehicles that are not directly involved in the business of the Cemetery are not permitted. Snowmobiles and unregistered motor vehicles such as motor scooters, go carts, and all-terrain vehicles are prohibited within all Cemeteries except as may be needed.(Ex: motorized wheelchairs)

- F. Enforcement:** Any violation of these Rules and Regulations will be treated as a trespass or nuisance, depending on the violation, and will be referred to the Buckfield Town Manager or Oxford County Sheriff/Maine State Police accordingly. Violation of the Rules and Regulations may also lead to prosecution for violation of federal or state laws. Improper conduct or violation of these Rules and Regulations by anyone may result in a request to leave the Cemetery, and/or criminal prosecution.

- G. Waste:** Individuals who enter any Town Cemetery must carry out all waste that they create while in the Cemetery unless trash cans are provided. Depositing of waste, rubbish, and debris on the grounds of any Cemetery, or neighboring/adjacent property, is prohibited.

- H. Functions:** The only group functions that are allowed within the Cemeteries are funerals, burials, life celebrations/memorial services, and educational tours. Other types of functions are not permitted unless permission is sought and granted by the Town Manager with Select Board approval.

- I. Corrections:** The Town reserves and shall have, the right to correct any errors that may be made by it or its agents in making interments, disinterment's or removals, or in the description, transfer or conveyance of any Lots of Interment or interment property. Such corrections may

include cancelling such conveyance and substituting and conveying in lieu thereof other Lots of Interment or other interment property of equal value and similar location as far as possible, or as may be selected by the Town, or, in the sole discretion of the Town, by refunding the amount of money paid to the Town on account of said conveyance. In the event such error shall involve the interment of the remains of any person in such property, the Town reserves the right to remove or transfer such remains so interred to such other property of equal value and similar location as may be substituted and conveyed in lieu thereof.

- J. **Overseer/Supervision:** The Town Manager or its designee shall have charge of the grounds and property within all Cemeteries and all persons visiting the Cemeteries, whether Grantees of Lots or otherwise.

- K. **Town Clerks:** The Town Clerks of Buckfield shall have and perform all administrative duties required by the town and the State of Maine including but not limited to the keeping of official records, the registrations of deaths, permits for disposal/interments and the collection of fees for services provided and lots sold.

- L. **Losses:** Reasonable precautions will be taken to protect Grantees from loss or damage, but the Town will not be responsible for loss or damage from causes beyond their reasonable control, and especially from damage caused by the elements, an act of God, common enemy, thieves, vandals, malicious mischief-makers, explosions, unavoidable accidents, invasions, insurrections, riots, or order of any military or civil authority, whether the same be direct or collateral.

SECTION 2: RIGHTS OF INTERMENT

- A. **Contact:** Individuals considering the purchase of a Lot (s) or contributing to the Cemetery Endowment Fund for perpetual care should contact the Town Clerks who will help in aiding the individual thru the process and supply all necessary forms for recording said purchase and/or contribution.

- B. **Lots:** The Town Clerks will issue a Burial Lot (right to bury human remains or to bury the ashes of a human being, upon the payment in full of the current price for such Lot (s). All Grantees who purchase a burial lot are subject to all Rules and Regulations. No Lot shall be used for any

purpose other than the burial or the memorializing of the human dead, or the cremains of the human dead.

- C. **Payment:** Complete payment of the purchase price for the burial lot(s) must be made to the Town before any burial is permitted. No partial payments will be accepted. The Town will issue an executed deed signifying the granting of the Lot.
- D. Thirty percent (30%) of the payment for burial lots shall be added to the Town's Cemetery Perpetual Care Fund. The principal of the Perpetual Care Fund is nonrefundable and must remain intact in trust in perpetuity for the care of the Cemeteries. It shall be invested and a prudent portion of the net income and appreciation from this Fund shall be applied annually by the Town to the operating costs of the Cemetery maintenance budget.

- E. **Grantee:** The Grantee is the individual who has purchased the Burial Lot (s), or has inherited the Burial Lot (s) from a deceased predecessor Grantee. The Grantee "owns" the Burial Lot (s), but does not own real property, just the right to use one or more specific burial sites in the Cemetery subject to all of the Rules and Regulations as well as applicable state laws. It shall be the duty of the Grantee (or Grantee's descendants or assigns) to notify the Town of any change of address or ownership by inheritance. Any purported change in ownership must be supported by adequate evidence to the satisfaction of the Town Clerks.

- F. **Descent:** The laws of the State of Maine govern the descent of title to Burial Lot (s). Upon the death of a Grantee, the heirs or devisees of such person should file with the Town Clerks proof of ownership for the purpose of correcting the record. Notarized statements as to relationship and certified copies of wills or court decrees (if any) are normally sufficient. No lot can be sold privately for profit. The Town shall charge an administrative fee for each descent of title of each burial lot. (See Attached Price List)

- G. **Repurchase:** The Town has no obligation to repurchase Burial Lot (s) from Grantees. Each and every request to repurchase shall be considered by the Town Manager/ Select Board and will be decided on a case by case basis. Prior decisions to repurchase or not to repurchase Burial Lot (s) will not have any bearing or influence on any subsequent request to repurchase. If the Town decides to repurchase Burial Lot (s), it will pay the Grantee no more than the price originally paid by the Grantee for the Burial Lot (s), less the Perpetual Care Fund portion (30%) which will be retained in the Perpetual Care Fund of the Town.

- H. **Transfer:** Grantees may transfer Burial Lot (s) to other parties but, will not be recognized unless the Town is notified. Transfer of the deed must be done at the Town Office. If Perpetual Care

was not previously paid for on the Lot (s) to be transferred, the Perpetual Care Fee at the current rate shall be paid in full prior to issuance of the executed Transfer of Burial Lot (s) Form. The Town shall charge an administrative fee for each transfer of each burial lot (s). (See Attached Form).

[(See Sections 2 F & G above)]

- I. **Exchanges:** The Town may, but is not obligated to, allow exchanges of Burial Lot (s) for different burial lot (s) within its Cemeteries. The Town Manager and Town Clerks shall consider requests for such exchanges. If Perpetual Care was not previously paid for the Burial Lot (s) to be transferred, the Perpetual Care Fee at the current rate shall be paid in full prior to issuance of the executed Transfer of Burial Lot (s) Form. The Cemetery shall charge an administrative fee for each exchange of each burial lot (s). (See Attached Price List)

SECTION 3: CARE OF BURIAL SITES

- A. **General:** The general care of the surface conditions of the Cemeteries is the responsibility of the Town and includes maintaining roads/lanes; maintaining water lines and faucets; cutting the grass, trimming bushes and trees (removal if necessary), and raking and cleaning the grounds. The Town assumes the responsibility for the care of monuments/markers of designated Town Memorial Lots and those others required by State Law.

- B. **Burial Lot:** Burial Lot is the basic unit of space within the Cemeteries used or intended to be used for the burial of human remains. It is also commonly referred to as a single “grave site” or “burial space.”

- C. **Boundary:** No new burial lot(s) shall be defined by a fence, railing, curbing, hedge, crypt, or enclosure of any description however “corner markers” are acceptable.

- D. **Artificial Decoration:** No artificial decorations of any kind that would be considered a hazard, will be allowed in the Cemeteries.

- E. **Removal:** The Town or it’s designee has the right to remove all artificial decorating including but not limited to floral designs ,lights, vases, decorations, flower boxes, boxed shrubs, wreaths, plants, and other materials placed in Cemeteries that, in their opinion, become unsightly, dangerous, detrimental, diseased, or that interfere with normal maintenance of Cemeteries.

- F. **Cleanup:** The Town shall direct its designee to conduct a fall cleanup no later than October 30th every year, and a spring cleanup no later than the 1st of May every year. Any items of value to the Grantees shall be removed by the Grantee prior to the cleanup periods.

SECTION 4: INTERMENTS

- A. **Timing:** Cemeteries shall be open for interments at the discretion of the Town. There shall be no interments permitted after November 1 or after the first snow or frost, until the following spring thaw is complete.

- B. **Delay:** The Town shall not be responsible or held liable for any costs or damages for any delay in an interment due to a written timely protest to the interment, by a third party, or where the Rules and Regulations or any State law have not been complied with. The Town is under no obligation to recognize any protest of an interment unless it is in writing and delivered to the Town Clerks/ Town Manager, upon which time the Town will have 15 days to respond to said written notice.

- C. **Location:** When an interment is to be made, the location of such interment shall be designated by the Grantee of the Burial Lot (s) or their representative or agent. Should the Grantee or their representative fail or neglect to make such designation, particularly when the Grantee owns Burial Lot (s) in same and/or multiple Cemeteries, the Town reserves the right to make or direct the interment in a location designated by the Town Manager. Any individual or groups of individuals who presents themselves as having the authority of the Grantee for this purpose of locating an interment shall certify in writing that they have such authority and accept full responsibility and liability for their actions, and will hold the Town and its agents, harmless from any liability, including legal costs, on the account of such authority and disposition.

- D. **Instructions:** Prior to any interment, Grantees or their heirs or representatives are required to provide the Town Clerk(s) a written communication as to the location of the burial. The Town cannot be responsible for a mistake as to the particular space or location of the lot resulting from lack of precise and proper written instructions (for example, mistake caused by any order given by telephone).

- E. **Grave Liners:** In order to maintain a high standard of care and to eliminate sunken graves, all burials must be made using rigid and durable outside containers (commonly known as “vaults,” “grave liners,” and “concrete boxes”) made of natural stone, reinforced concrete, or any similar container approved by the Town. Cremated remains must be interred in a permanent container.

- F. Limits:** All interments shall be buried at a minimum of 4 to 6 feet or placed in a mausoleum or columbarium (vault) approved by the Town. No double depth standard interments will be made. All interments of multiple bodies/cremains shall be located and made in accordance with these Rules and Regulations. (See attached Burial Lot Sizes and Interment Allowances)

- G. Prohibition:** Interments are to be performed only by Town approved Funeral Burial Service providers or its designee. Grantees and other parties not approved by the Town are specifically prohibited from performing interments. The Town will take all reasonable action to rectify any such prohibited burials and seek damages and costs from violators of this rule. The Town will not be responsible for recording the unauthorized burial, including the identity of the deceased.

- H. Movement:** In the event Monuments and Markers have to be moved or removed to gain access to burial sites for purposes on interment or inurnment, it is the Grantee's responsibility along with the approved funeral or burial service provider (s) to restore the moved items to their initial position as soon as time and weather permit, or no later than thirty days. In the event that a Monument or Marker has to be moved or removed for repairs or maintenance, from any town cemetery, the grantee, heir or business conducting the removal must have written approval from the Town Clerk's/Town Manager.

- I. Directors:** All funeral or burial parties entering the Cemeteries shall be under the direction of a funeral director licensed by the state of Maine who shall abide by these Rules and Regulations. All commercial service providers entering any Town Cemeteries to perform services or deliver commercial products must have liability insurance and workers' compensation coverage consistent with the Town's requirements and present proof of insurance to the Town Manager. The Town Manager/ Town Clerks shall maintain a file of such proof of insurance and update it annually. Liability insurance must not be less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence.

- J. Casket/Urn:** Once a casket containing a body or an urn with cremated remains is within the Cemetery, it shall not be opened except by a licensed funeral director or their assistants or on an order signed by a court of competent jurisdiction.

- K. Fee(s):** For Town of Buckfield Cemetery costs and administration fees- see attached.

SECTION 5: PLANTS

- A. Shrubs:** Shrubs shall be contained within the boundary of the lot.

[Title 30-A, MRSA Section 3001]

- B. Trees:** Planting of trees are prohibited, except that the Town may Plant trees designated in the Town Memorial Lots for the beautification of the cemeteries.

[Title 30-A, MRSA Section 3001]

- C. Burials:** Planted materials may have to be removed to gain access to burial sites. The Town, is not responsible for damage or losses resulting from removal of plant material during any interment, disinterment or inurnment process, and is not responsible for replacing them.

- D. Landscape:** The Town will undertake to maintain, to the extent practicable, the planting and pruning of trees and shrubs to preserve the general landscape features of the Cemeteries, but will not undertake to maintain individual plantings, or containers of plants.

SECTION 6: MONUMENTS AND MARKERS

- A. Definitions:** Monument shall mean any above grade level burial site identification object made of stone or stone and bronze. Marker (also commonly called “headstones” or “flush markers or memorials”) shall mean any grade level burial site identification object made of stone or stone and bronze. To keep with the general look of the cemeteries all monuments must be of such design as to not take away from the adjacent memorials.

- B. Location:** The location of all Monuments and markers shall be contained within the boundaries of the Burial Lot and follow all State installation laws that apply.

[Title 30-A, MRSA, Section 3001]

- C. Burial Lot (s):** Monument and markers installation is the responsibly of the grantee.

[Title 30-A, MRSA, Section 3001]

- D. Multiple Burial Sites:** Multiple burial sites that abut each other, and owned by one grantee, may have a larger Monument (s) than a single burial lot.

[Title 30-A, MRSA, Section 3001]

- E. Repair:** Monuments and Markers erected by Grantees shall be maintained in a safe condition by the Grantee (including heirs and assigns), and the repair and replacement of same, after damage from any cause and shall be at the expense of the Grantee. The Grantee shall not remove for repair or maintenance any Monument/Markers without prior authorization by the Town Manager. Notwithstanding the primary maintenance responsibility of the Grantee, the Town

may, at its sole discretion, undertake to clean Monuments and Markers and to resolve safety concerns.

- F. **Installation:** All commercial Monuments and Markers installers must show proof of liability insurance before the start of work.

[Title 30-A, MRSA, Section 3001; (see also Section 6E and Section 3E)]

SECTION 7: DISINTERMENTS

- A. **Law:** Disinterment are governed by Title 22, Section 2843, and M.R.S.A. A permit for disinterment or removal of a dead human body must be obtained from the State and presented for notification approval from the Town Clerks.

[Title 22, Subtitle2, Part6, Chapter 701, Section 2843(2) and Section 3029(1, 2, 3)]

- B. **Fee:** Cost of the disinterment shall be the responsibility of the party causing or seeking the disinterment. The Town will charge an administrative fee for all disinterment.

- C. **Opening:** The Town Manager or designee will allow and observe the opening of a grave upon showing, of requisite identification, authorization documentation and permit. In all disinterment cases, the responsibility of the Town shall be limited to identifying the grave and the actual disinterment will be made by the Town or its designee unless otherwise court ordered.

SECTION 8: RULES OF CONDUCT

- A. **Mischief:** No person shall destroy, mutilate, deface, injure or remove any Monument, Marker, gravestone, fence, railing, other structure, plant, or other Cemetery items within any Town Cemetery.

- B. **Pets:** Dogs must be leashed at all times. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs.

- C. **Prohibited:** Some 'personal' articles used to decorate lots are considered injurious to the beauty and dignity of the Cemeteries, can create safety hazards, and reduce the peaceful ambiance therein. The following objects are NOT permitted in any Cemetery:

- D. **Unsightly items:** (profane/obscene objects/rusted metals).

[Title 30-A, MRSA, Section3001]

- E. **Eternal flames/candles or any open flames:** (no Fire of any kind)

[Title 30-A MRSA, Section 3151; Title 25, MRSA, Section 9201]

- F. **Weapons:** except those used by honor guards or in military funerals or carried by law enforcement officers consistent with their policies and procedures.

[Title 25, MRSA, Section 2002 and 2003]

- G. **Substance:** No person shall be in possession of or consume any alcoholic beverage within any Cemetery. No person shall be in possession of or consume any illegal substance within any Town Cemeteries.

[Title 28-A, MRSA, Section 653]

- H. **Peace:** No person shall behave in a loud, indecent, or disorderly manner in any Town Cemetery or create any unnecessary disturbance therein. It is of the utmost importance that there should be a strict observance of the proprieties within the Town Cemeteries. The discharge of firearms or fireworks therein is strictly prohibited. This is not to be construed as prohibiting ceremonial volleys with blank charges by properly supervised honor guards as a tribute to a deceased person if such ceremonial undertaking has been previously scheduled with the Town.

- I. **Dignity:** Horseplay, games, contests, camping, sports activities, or any similar activity or gathering not in keeping with the purpose and dignity of the Cemeteries are prohibited within all Town Cemeteries.

- J. **Horses:** Horses are prohibited from the Cemeteries except for the purpose of funeral, ceremonial, or memorial functions. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their horses.

SECTION 9: Adoption and Effective Date

- A. **The Buckfield Select Board adopted these Cemetery Rules and Regulations at a meeting duly called on June 6, 2023 and by doing so repealed any previous rules adopted.**
